
27th September – 16th October Nicky May & Sally Jones 'Late Summer Light'

Sally Jones says that Munnings and Singer Sargent are her strongest influences. She captures the emotions and narratives of people, animals and places in fine detail, in both oils and soft pastels.

Nicky May's work is a subjective take on the fields and lanes local to her in Week St Mary, or the nearby coastline. She starts from what she sees when walking, then the process of painting imbues the work with the colours and feelings that the landscape awakes in her.

27th September – 16th October Rob Crisp 'Venice Reflections: Traditional and Contemporary'

Returning Westcountry Artist Rob Crisp's exhibition shows the creative journey from his traditional oil paintings, to a new more contemporary painting style and method of depicting the beautiful city of Venice. It captures the essence of city life, the architecture, Basilicas, palaces, alleyways and arches. The waterways and canals that reflect the vivid colours of the buildings, bridges, working boats, gondolas and masks.
